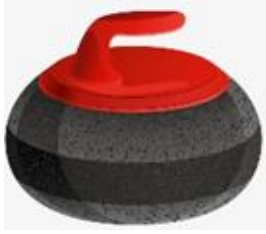

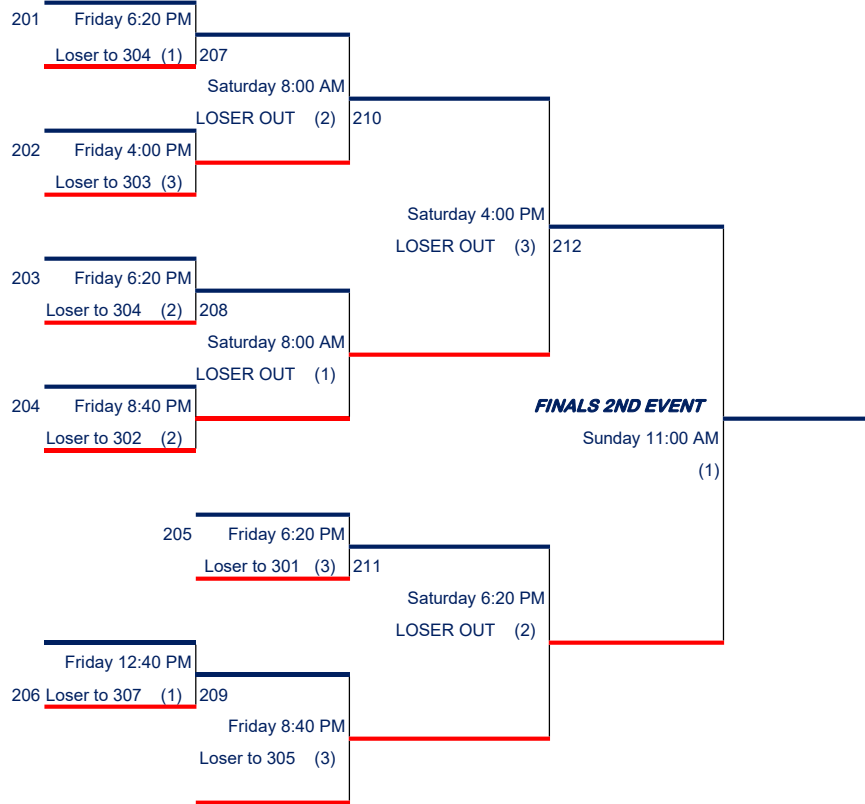

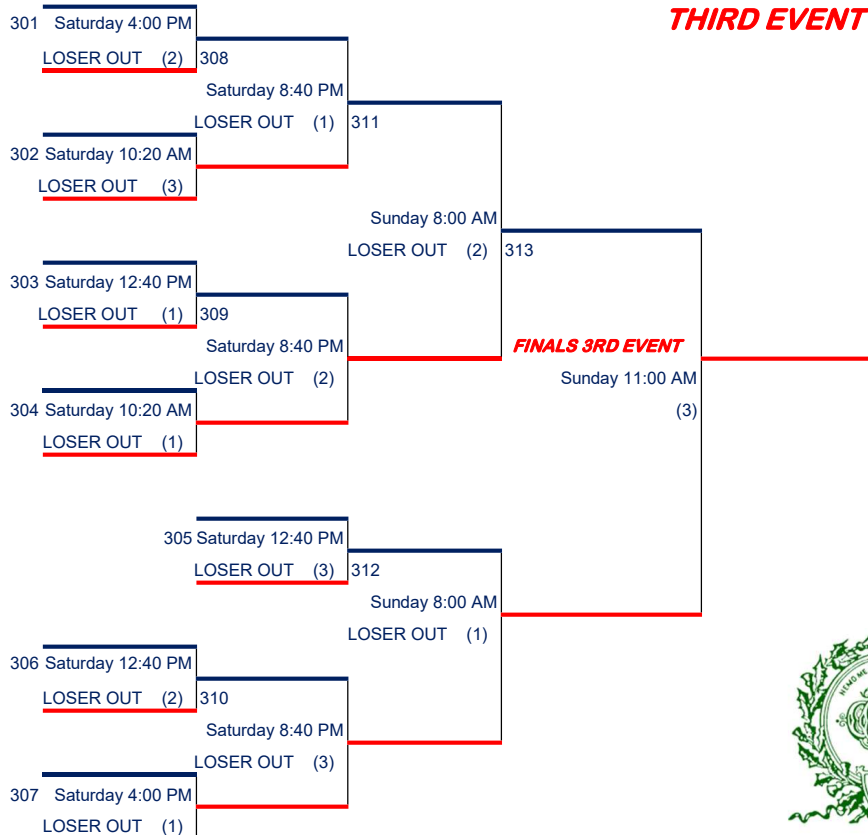

Rules and Clarifications to GNCC 5 Year and Under Events

Francis Dykes Memorial Bonspiel; Raymond Kayser Memorial Bonspiel; Elisabeth Childs Challenge

1. These Bonspiels shall be held annually at such times as are designated by the GNCC.
2. The bonspiels shall rotate among the affiliated clubs of the GNCC that have manufactured ice.
3. These competitions are sponsored by the GNCC to provide an opportunity for its curlers with five (5) or fewer years of curling experience to compete against opponents of similar ability. The intention is to include all teams from the GNCC member clubs wishing to participate in the event.
4. At least one rink from each GNCC member club shall be accepted. To the extent that the host club can accept additional teams, one additional team will be accepted from each GNCC club submitting more than one team. If space permits at the host club, one additional team will be selected from each club submitting multiple entries until the maximum number of teams the host club can accommodate is selected. It is the responsibility of the GNCC member club to place their multiple entries in numerical order for selection.
5. The [USA Curling Rules of Curling: Club and Bonspiel Use](#) shall govern the rules of play, except as specifically waived or modified by the GNCC event.
 1. All ties will be decided by a last shot draw (LSD), closest draw to the button with sweeping (throwing team only), with the exception of finals.
 2. All games including finals shall be eight (8) ends.
 3. The delivery of team stones in a mixed format must be performed with alternating genders.
6. The entry fee for each bonspiel shall be set by the host club and the GNCC.
7. Eligibility:
 1. Members having curled longer than five (5) curling seasons shall not be eligible to compete.
 - i. Ten (10) games per season anywhere constitutes a season.
 - ii. The curling season starts on May 1st and ends April 30th.
 - iii. Junior curling (ages 14 - 21), but not youth curling (ages 13 and below), experience counts towards the five (5) curling seasons.
 2. All substitutes shall be governed by eligibility rule 7(i) above.
 3. Each participant is responsible for determining his/her eligibility.
 4. The eligibility of team members shall be certified to the host club, using the official GNCC 5yr and Under Eligibility form, by the president, treasurer or GNCC representative of the team's club with respect rule 7(i) with confirmation that curling experience includes all years of curling.
8. The Francis Dykes, Raymond Kayser, and Elisabeth Childs Challenge bonspiels are adult events, and they are open to GNCC members in good standing that are at least 21 years old as of the day of the event.
9. A Head Official or Rules Official has the ability to place a team, in particular the skip, on the clock if slow play is ensuing.
10. All inquiries or protests by an entered team shall be resolved on site at the time of the protest or inquiry by the On-Site Chair in consultation with the GNCC event Chair if necessary.

LOCAL RULES

All Games will be played under Grand National Rules, with the following additions and modifications:

1. The maximum duration of all games will be eight ends, unless timed out as explained below or otherwise conceded by the losing team.
2. The five-stone Free Guard Zone Rule will be observed.
3. All substitutes will be approved and, if necessary, assigned by the Cape Cod Curling Club spiel committee. Substitutes may play any position approved by the spiel chairs.
4. Any team not ready to play at the scheduled time will forfeit one end and one stone for each ten minutes the game is delayed. At thirty minutes, the game will be forfeited.
5. Two hours are allocated for each game. A countdown clock is set for 1:50 at the beginning of each game. With fifteen-minutes remaining, a warning buzzer will sound. At zero, a second buzzer sounds. Prior to the second buzzer sounding (at time zero) the final stone of the end being played must have come to rest in order to play an additional end. EXCEPTION: The finals of the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th events will not be timed; all eight ends will be played.
6. If a game is tied after regular play, each skip will throw one rock. Closest to the button wins, with measurement done by the spiel committee. Only the throwing team may sweep. EXCEPTION: This tie breaker rule will not apply to the finals. If tied after regular play, an extra full end will be played. All measurements in regular play and extra ends will be made by the Vice Skips. A spiel committee member will be available to resolve conflicts concerning measurements and for rule interpretations.
7. The WCF rule regarding broom heads and stick delivery will not be imposed.
8. Teams are free to change positions and throwing order between games but must inform the spiel committee and their opponent before the game commences

Warm Room: Broomstacking after each game will take place at the tables in front of each sheet in the warm room. We have a large comfortable warm room. There are 2 couches, a club chair with ottoman for relaxing between draws. There are chairs along the glass to watch the games.

Bar/Dining Room: We have a full bar. It is cash only, pay as you go; we do not allow bar tabs. There are tables in the dining room for your use between draws. There are also chairs along the glass to watch the games from the dining area.

Locker Rooms/Restrooms: Please stow your gear in the locker rooms not in the warm room or dining/bar area. It is safe to leave your gear overnight. We have a 3-stall restroom adjacent to the women's locker room. As this is a women's event, the men's locker room may be used for overflow if necessary. Keep in mind, several men are volunteering at the bonspiel; they will be using the restrooms in their locker room.

Parking/One Way Traffic Pattern:

- **Parking:** There should be ample parking for the event. We have 31 paved spaces; 2 of which are reserved for handicap vehicles. There is also parking on the gravel. The access to the gravel parking lot will be marked by orange cones. Please do not park in the access lane. If the paved and gravel parking lots are full, there is parking on the grass along the right side of the exit driveway. Park nose-in on the grass. Please do not park on the left side of the exit driveway, that is not our property.
- **One-Way Traffic Pattern:** We have a one-way traffic pattern. Enter the parking areas at the CCCC sign. The exit driveway is shared with our neighbor, The Falmouth Sports Center (FSC). Please yield to any traffic coming from the FSC on your left as you exit CCCC parking area. Please do not back up in our parking lot, make the loop around if you missed a parking spot.

In-House Activities Between Draws

Raffles: There will be a Raffle Table and a 50/50 Raffle. Tickets will be on sale until 8:00 pm Saturday: 1 for \$5; 3 for \$10; 10 for \$20. Raffle drawings will be Saturday, February 25th at 8:30pm.

Retail Therapy: We have a club store with CCCC souvenirs for purchase. Skips & Stones, Jeanie Yaroch, will be in the warm room at various times during the weekend. Dakota Curling Supplies, Jon Barbagallo, will be at CCCC Tuesday and Wednesday 4pm – 8pm; Thursday 10am – 3pm.

Tasting: **FRIDAY**, February 24th at 1:30 pm, **Cape Cod Distillers** will be offering a tasting of their spirits and ready to drink (RTD) beverages. **Cost per flight is \$15.** The flight is a taste of 5 of their locally distilled liquors accompanied by their RTDs. **SATURDAY**, February 25th at 1:30 pm the bar will be serving **Frazee's Wine Cocktails.**

Entertainment: Friday night there will be music and trivia after dinner beginning at 7:30 pm. We are looking forward to hearing your team songs! Saturday night vocalist Vanna Pacella will be on the keyboard in the warm room. Live music and dancing during the evening draws.

Elisabeth Childs

Elisabeth Calder was born in 1921 in Utica, NY. As the daughter of Jack Calder, Elisabeth was exposed to the sport of curling very early at the Utica Curling Club. She married Edward "Ted" Childs in 1951 and moved to Norfolk, CT where she introduced curling to the area, helping to create the Norfolk Curling Club in 1956. Norfolk hosts an annual men's bonspiel, the Calder trophy, in honor of Elisabeth's father.



Event History

While watching the Francis Dykes competition in Utica, New York, in 1989, a group of women curlers asked why there was not an equivalent competition for women with five or fewer years of curling experience. Bill Rotton was Utica's GNCC representative at the time and was tasked with approaching the Executive Committee to sanction a women's bonspiel. The GNCC accepted this new bonspiel at their annual meeting in 1990, and the inaugural event was scheduled for the following season. Peggy Rotton donated pins the first year and recruited Gwen Krailo to design a pin specific to the event. Mrs. Rotton and Mrs. Krailo have donated the pins ever since.

The first Women's Challenge had four events and was held at the Norfolk Curling Club in 1991. Eight teams participated, and every team made the finals. Elisabeth Childs watched the games from a chair on the back boards at the away end. Mrs. Krailo asked Mrs. Childs if she would lend her name to the bonspiel. Her prompt and empathic response was, "No! I'm not dead yet." In 2010, the year after Mrs. Childs passed away, the Women's Challenge was re-named in her honor.

The four events were named for the four women largely responsible for promoting the event.



- ❖ **Peggy Rotton Award:** The First Event is named for Peggy Rotton of the Utica Curling Club for her pin donation.
- ❖ **Gwen Krailo Award:** The Second Event is named after Gwen Krailo of the Nashua Curling Club for her pin design and donation.
- ❖ **Lorraine Wood Award:** The Third Event is named after Lorraine Wood of the Nashua Curling Club for her donation of the pin dye.
- ❖ **Shelly Dropkin Award:** The Fourth Event recognizes Shelly Dropkin of the Broomstones Curling Club for her serving as the first chairperson of the Challenge.
